The Victorian junior Championships have been organised by the Canterbury Junior Chess Club [previously the Whitehorse Junior Chess Club] since 2003 when we took over from Chesskids at the insistence of the then president of Chess Victoria. The change has been good for the tournaments and Canterbury Junior Chess with steady increases in participation almost every year. The tournament has however never set the world on fire and has never caught the imagination of the various coaching organizations [with some notable exceptions] and this is the first year as far as I can remember when an organisation [Northern star Chess] has dipped its toe in the water and put up some sponsorship money.

It is sort of cute to see the regular performers like Laurence Matheson and Savithri Narenthran working their way through the various title opportunities Laurence for example won the under 8 in 2004 The under 10 in 2006 the under12 in 2007 the under 14 in 2008 and the big one in 2010. 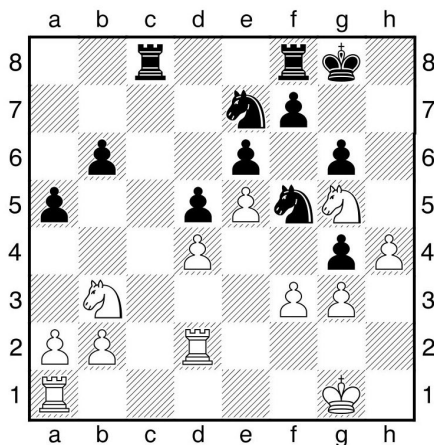
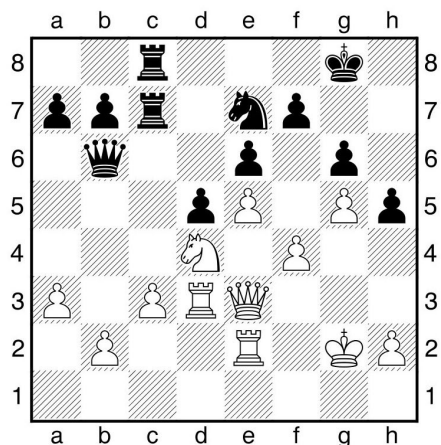

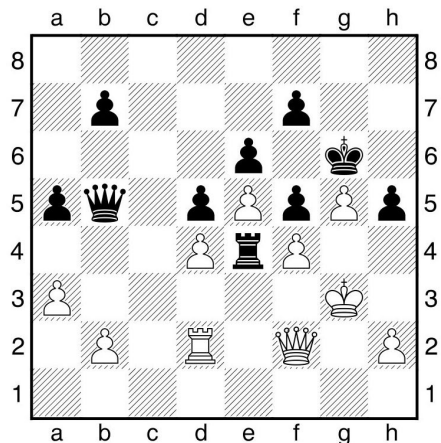
