Gus D'Onfrio lost to Karl Zelesco. The game featured a well known pawn sacrifice by Karl. Gus unwisely accepted the pawn and suffered the consequences. Nevertheless Karl had to work very hard to defeat Gus who put up stern resistance.

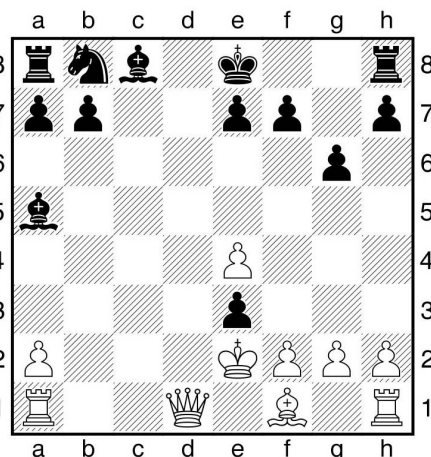

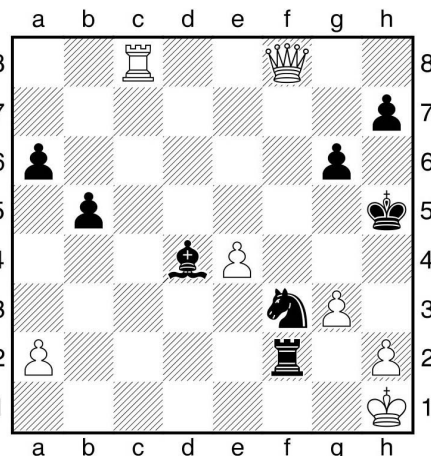
