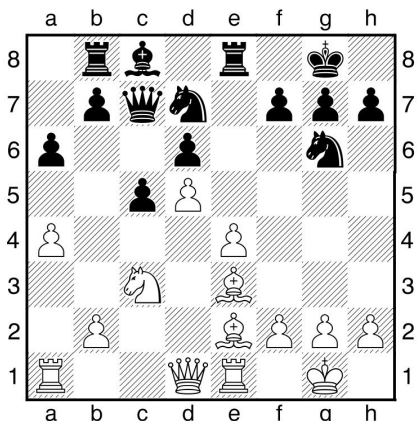

Overseas news: The 8th Round of the 4th Final Masters in Bilbao saw Nakamura and Carlsen get within one win of the leader Ivanchuk (who drew). The tournament takes place from 25 September to 11 October with 6 participants playing two games with each other. The players are Magnus Carlsen (rated 2823), Vishvanathan Anand (2817), Levon Aronian (2807), Vassily Ivanchuk (2765), Hikary Nakamura (2753), Francisco Vallejo (2716). The first five games of the tournament were played in Sao -Paulo. Vasily Ivanchuk was robbed of his luggage at gunpoint near his hotel Melia Sao Paulo. Ivanchuk's wife Oksana had her passport stolen but they managed to board their flight to Munich. Despite of that he is still the sole leader of the tournament.
