In the last issue I briefly mentioned that when submitting our bids President Peter Tsai and his sidekick yours truly were quietly confident that our submissions for the Vic Open and the Vic Junior would be highly competitive. And here are some of the reasons for our confidence

- Location, location, location. The Box Hill venue is almost the exact geographic centre of Melbourne it has ample parking, is very close to Canterbury railway station and buses pass the front door
- There is space for up to 120 players
- 5 working DGT boards. Almost unheard of in this country
- Good prize money due to the support we have from the Bendigo Bank.

- Moderate entry fees.
- A low key approach. This may sound a little old fashioned but we believe that if you looking for support for your submissions it is not a good idea to antagonise those you wish to impress.
- Willingness to use the ACF approved swiss draw system and the ACF rating system.
- Tournament organisation skills. Our tournaments generally run smoothly and the few disputes we have, are quickly resolved
- FIDE arbiters at the club. 3 of our members have passed the FIDE arbiters exam. One of whom is now titled

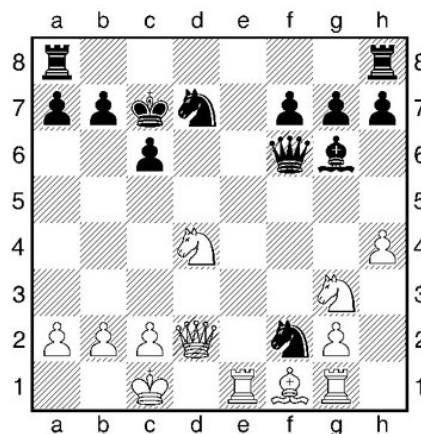
